Each year, approximately 35-38 men and women who live or work in Pinellas County are selected for the program from a cross-section of the professionals, business, government, education, religious, civic and minority organizations. Leadership Pinellas Program provides a variety of venues in which interested citizens can better understand some of our important current and impending community functions and how they can become involved to help find solutions. Leadership Pinellas provides our community with a continuing source of men and women motivated to assume leadership positions in civic, social, professional and charitable institutions.

Over a 10-month period, class members attend a 2-day orientation session, eight full-day program days, a 3-day trip to the legislative session in Tallahassee, a law enforcement agency "Ride Along", and a graduation program.

Leadership Pinellas is part of a National Program. The first leadership program was established in Philadelphia in 1959 and has run continuously since then. The Association now has approximately 450 members, include Leadership Pinellas. Its mission is to strengthen and transform communities by enhancing the capacity of inclusive, community leadership efforts.
